Young Engineer of the Year honors will be accorded to Brian E. Kutz, PE, of Bethlehem, at the 35<sup>th</sup> Annual Engineers Banquet organized by the Lehigh Valley Engineering Council held Friday, February 27<sup>th</sup> at the Holiday Inn Conference Center in Breinigsville, PA.

“I have built my career on embracing new challenges and volunteering for difficult assignments,” says Mr. Kutz.
